Junior Coaches and Support Staff: Code of Behaviour



All CATS Cricket Club personnel must at all times act in accordance with

The Australian Cricket "Looking After our Kids" Code of Behaviour which can be found at

www.cricketaustralia.com.au/about/safeguarding

It will apply when playing, training or taking part in club-sanctioned activities.

Below are some key points of the Code of Behaviour

- Operate within the rules and Spirit of Cricket and teach your players to do the same.
- Place the safety and welfare of the participants above all else.
- Show concern and caution toward sick and injured players. Follow the advice of a qualified person when determining whether an injured player is ready to recommence training or competition.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person, regardless of their age, race, gender, ability, cultural background, sexuality or religion.
- Remember that young people participate for pleasure and winning is only part of the fun.
- Never ridicule or yell at a young player for making a mistake or not coming first.
- Be reasonable in your demands on players' time, energy and enthusiasm.
- Ensure that the time players spend with you is a positive experience.
- Do not tolerate abusive, bullying or threatening behaviour.
- Promote fair play over winning at any cost. Avoid overplaying the talented players all young players need and deserve equal time, attention and opportunities.
- Respect the decisions of officials, coaches and administrators.
- Show respect and courtesy to all involved with the sport.
- Display responsible behaviour in relation to alcohol and other drugs.
- Help each person (player, official, etc) to reach their potential. Respect the talent, developmental stage
 and goals of each person and encourage them with positive and constructive feedback.
- Encourage and support opportunities for people to learn appropriate behaviours and skills.
- Support opportunities for participation in all aspects of the sport.
- Treat each participant as an individual.
- Obtain appropriate qualifications and keep up-to-date with the latest coaching practices and the principles of growth and development of participants.
- Act with integrity and objectivity, and accept responsibility for your decisions and actions.
- Ensure your decisions and actions contribute to a harassment-free environment.
- Wherever practical, avoid unaccompanied and unobserved one-on-one activity (when in a supervisory capacity or where a power imbalance exists) with people under the age of 18.
- Ensure that any physical contact with another person is appropriate to the situation and necessary for the person's skill development.
- Be honest and do not allow your qualifications or coaching experience to be misrepresented.
- Never advocate or condone the use of illicit drugs or other banned performance enhancing substances or methods.
- Never participate in or advocate practices that involve match fixing.
- Not behave in any manner, which may bring the Club into disrepute.
